

# FELONY VOTING IN MISSISSIPPI



## ONLY 23 FELONIES

*ARE DISENFRANCHISING IN MISSISSIPPI*

Outside of these felony charges, registered Mississippi voters are eligible to vote while incarcerated.

If you were convicted of any of the other 23 crimes federally or in another state, then you can retain your right to vote. **ONLY CONVICTIONS IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI ARE DISENFRANCHISING.**

# Ways to Restore Your Rights

THERE ARE THREE WAYS TO RESTORE YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IF YOU HAVE BEEN DISENFRANCHISED:

**1** A PARDON BY THE GOVERNOR

**2** EXPUNGMENT OF CRIMINAL RECORD

**3** APPLY TO HAVE YOUR RIGHTS RESTORED

THROUGH THE LEGISLATIVE PROCESS BY CONTACTING YOUR STATE REPRESENTATIVE OR SENATOR

## 3 PLACES TO REGISTER

- Apply With Your Local NAACP Branch
- Go To Your Circuit Clerks Office
- Download the form online on the Secretary of State's Website and Mail In.

## 5 CHECKPOINTS TO VOTING

- Be A US Citizen
- Be A MS Resident
- Be 18 By the Time of Next Election
- Register 30 Days Prior To Election
- Not Be Legally Disenfranchised
