## What is the Medicaid Expansion Coverage Gap in Mississippi?

In Mississippi, some 96,000 uninsured adults with low incomes are in the Medicaid coverage gap – too poor to qualify for Affordable Care Act (ACA) marketplace assistance because they have incomes below the poverty line, yet ineligible for Medicaid because their state hasn't enacted the ACA Medicaid expansion.





## Mississippi Can Afford Medicaid Expansion

According to the state economist, Mississippi would save money by expanding Medicaid.

- Total estimated annual costs of Medicaid expansion in the state from 2022-2027: between \$186 million and \$207 million.
- Total estimated savings of Medicaid expansion to the state in 2022: \$512 million; in 2023: \$527 million; in 2024: \$215 million; in 2025: \$219 million; in 2026: \$223 million; and in 2027: \$227 million.
